

DEPUTY MEDICAL EXAMINER DANE COUNTY, WISCONSIN

This is an exceptional opportunity for a seasoned forensic medical professional to live and work in a dynamic, vibrant and growing community, the state capital the State of Wisconsin. The Chief Medical Examiner is seeking an MD with certifications in Anatomical and Forensic pathology to join a high quality team with an outstanding new facility as the organization grows and develops for the future.

The successful candidate for the position of Deputy Medical Examiner for Dane County should meet the following criteria: The ideal candidate possesses an MD degree and be board certified in Anatomical and Forensic Pathology by the American Board of Pathology; Minimally, the candidate will have board certification in Anatomical Pathology and be eligible to sit for Forensic Boards and obtain Board Certification in Forensic Pathology within two years of employment; Currently possess or have the ability to obtain an unrestricted license to practice medicine in the state of Wisconsin.

Successful candidates must be of sound moral character and must have a reputation for honesty and trustworthiness.

The Deputy Medical Examiner reports to the Deputy Chief Medical Examiner and is appointed by the Chief Medical Examiner.

Possession of or ability to obtain a valid Wisconsin driver's license; access to reliable personal vehicle transportation; and availability to work evenings, weekends and holidays. The successful candidate must maintain Dane County residency following employment.

Prior to appointment, candidates will be subject to a thorough background investigation, a physical examination, and may also be required to take a psychological examination. The recruitment process may also include interviews with partners in the criminal justice field as well as other experts in the area of forensic medicine.

Dane County operates under a Board of Supervisors/County Executive form of government. The Board of Supervisors, which consists of 37 elected officials from each of the districts in the County, is the policy-making body for the County. The elected County Executive is the Chief Executive Officer of the County. The Chief Medical Examiner reports to the County Executive.

The Dane County Medical Examiner's Office includes 20 personnel in the following categories: 2 forensic pathologists (budgeted for 4), 6 FTE investigative Staff, up to 6 LTE Investigative Staff, 1 Director of Operations, a Deputy Director of Operations, 2 Administrative Support Staff, 2 Autopsy Technicians, and 3 Part-Time Autopsy Technicians. The current annual budget for the Office is \$2.8M. The Office just moved into a new state-of-the art facility.

The starting annual salary for the Deputy Medical Examiner position for Dane County will be market competitive and negotiable depending upon the qualifications and experience of the selected candidate (\$140,000 to \$200,000). An excellent fringe benefit plan will be provided as well. Reasonable relocation expense reimbursement will be negotiated.

This position is open until filled. First review of candidates will occur on October 27, 2017. *EOE*.
